Our final destination is the SAN MIGUEL PASSAGE between SANTA ROSA and SAN MIGUEL Islands. Depending on ocean conditions, we will either approach from the north side or the south side. Either way, we hope to take in all areas from South Point around Sandy Point into TALCOTT (or vice versa!) on the SANTA ROSA side and then cross the channel and dive the south side out to WYCOFF LEDGE and beyond or from Cardwell to Harris Point on the northeast side of SAN MIGUEL. This itnierary should take us to the best ABALONE, SCALLOP and FISH areas in the channel. VIDEO and PHOTO opportunities are outstanding. Our overnight spot will again depend on the prevailing weather conditions. As always on our SAN MIGUEL area trips, if the weather cooperates we will also take in WILSON ROCK in lieu of of lesser dive spots!

Along with our planned diving we will enjoy all of the amenities the PEACE has to offer, including dive boat gourmet dinner Friday evening. We will also have a full compliment of Sea Diver goodies to add to the trip's enjoyment. Most of the dives will be suitable for all skill levels -- ocean conditions permitting -- and ANYONE can enjoy the boat, the food, the hot tub, Bill McGee, etc., etc.!!

Our only dive on the ENCORE in 1993 is to NINE FATHOM REEF, SAN CLEMENTE ISLAND and CASTLE ROCK. We will leave in the early AM from 22nd Street and run overnight to make our first dive at NINE FATHOM REEF. This is one of the most spectacular dives in the southern area, with purple coral, game, sea lions and other sea life to view and maybe PHOTOGRAPH or VIDEO.

This is The Sea Divers' fourth dive on the ENCORE — the largest boat in the Southern California fleet. ENCORE is 80 feet long, 25 feet wide, has 12 staterooms, ladies dressing room, 45 seat galley, walk—in freezer, large sundeck and color TV/VCR. We are limiting the trip to 32 divers which is extremely comfortable on a boat of this size.

Following the NINE FATHOM REEF dive, we will cruise south and east along SAN CLEMENTE, with the backside as first choice and the frontside as our alternate. The diving will provide a variety of underwater topography in what is typically excellent visibility. Water temperatures are rising, making for comfortable conditions. Game takers will not be disappointed, with FISH, SCALLOPS and ABALONE available. We plan to make our final dive back on the west end at CASTLE ROCK which will provide a relatively shallow dive on the beautiful reef structures around the rock. Those who just like to dive and enjoy the scenery can't pick a better dive. This trip is suitable for all skill levels. There will be typical Sea Diver goodies added to this charter.

Those who pay in full will be preassigned to their favorite bunk on a FIRST COME FIRST SERVED basis. For sign up call Kathi (McNally) at (310) 370-1657. Boarding will begin at 7:00 PM on Friday, 4 June, for a 1:00 AM departure on the 5th. NICE, NICE TRIP!!



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

FARNSWORTH AND THEN SURPRISE! . . .

For the second month in a row we overfilled our boat charter — this time on CHARISMA to Farnsworth. Many thanks to Roger S for bringing along so many friends from the 1992 UICC Instructor's course.

We left the dock just a few minutes past 6:00 AM which, at best, made for a 9:00 – 9:30 AM arrival over Farnsworth Banks. Unfortunately, CHARISMA's LORAN bellied up, so Roger H had to rely on the old line ups in the mist routine, making for a protracted search for the 55 foot high spot. Finally (but ACCURATELY), we anchored and divers began entering the water at about 10:15 AM. Visibility was in the 30–40 foot range with no current, some surge due to the low period 8 foot swells, and 59 degree F water temperature. Most divers stayed above 80 feet, but some made the usual 100 foot plus, typically "easy" at Farnsworth. I bottomed out on a flat ledge at just over 110 feet with a dark grey/blue hole going way on down!! With all of our divers safely back on the boat, we cruised off towards the West End leaving our spot to the GOLDEN DUBLOON.

With our deep, potentially difficult dive over, we headed for shallower areas, finally anchoring just west of Indian Rock in Emerald Bay. Beautiful!! The water was calm, blue, over 60 degrees, and only 40 feet deep. The sun was hot and the whole setting idyllic. Surprise, surprise!! There was a raging, and I mean raging, current which resulted in two of our divers — including a divemaster being picked up by the local "bay" boat and others grabbing the DOUBLE length current line and either working their way back on the line arriving at the step exhausted, or having to be pulled in by other Sea Divers and/or the deck hands. So much for idyllic — appearances can be misleading!!

With the late start at Farnsworth and the current problems at Indian Rock, the day was moving along all too quickly. Roger H agreed to stay out an extra hour or so, so that we could at least get in one more leisurely dive. We cruised along the really green front side of Catalina until we anchored just west of Empire Landing in about 30 feet of OVER 60 degree water. Visibility was about 30 feet, no current (!), calm and depths from zero at the beach on down to 60 feet plus. Most stayed above 40 feet. We pulled anchor about 3:45 PM and headed on back to 22nd Street under warm, sunny skies. A dozen or so of us were on the sun deck, a like number in the galley, and the rest snoozing below.

There were no reportable or awardable boobies to my knowledge. Kathi Mc and I again collected the usual batch of towels, odds and ends, and unmentionables to add to the club's next "auction." Are YOU missing anything?? Thanks once again for supporting us. SEE YOU IN MAY ON THE PEACE TWO DAY.

JADE COVE CAMPOUT 2-4 JULY 1993

Jade Cove is 40 miles south of Monterey and 40 miles north of San Simeon. It is noted for chunks of nephrite jade at and below the water line. It is real jade!! Once you find a nice size specimen, jade fever usually takes over. And, you can have three days to find some!

DIRECTIONS: It is approximately 5-6 hours driving time from the South Bay area to Jade Cove. Go north on 101 thru Santa Barbara to San Luis Obispo. Exit at the Hwy. 1 offramp for Morro Bay and head north to San Simeon. Twenty-nine miles past San Simeon you will pass through a very small town called Gorda. Look for the Plaskett Creek campground sign on the east side of Hwy. 1 about 2-1/2 to 3 miles north of Gorda.

WHAT TO DO: The diving at Jade Cove is noted for its beauty in addition to its gems. There are large lingcod and other rock fish for the gamesman. Usually there is a thick kelp bed to cope with and conditions can be quite variable. The hike to the beach is through 100 yards of meadowland and down a 150' cliff along a steep switch-back dirt trail. For those not wanting to cope with the cliff, several miles north is Willow Creek where you can drive down to the beach. It is a sandy beach entry with rocky patches out further that are great for the photographer and the browser. There are other things to do besides diving -- hiking, photography, bird watching, volleyball, catching up on R&R, and meeting fellow club members.

Monterey/Pt. Lobos is a one hour drive north on Hwy. 1. Reservations to dive Pt. Lobos must be made no earlier than one month in advance. If you are interested, contact Cathy Gale.

CAMPSITE & FEES: The club has reserved group campsite #3 on the southwest end of the campground. It can accommodate 50 people and 8 parking slots. The campsite is designed for tents and there are tables, fire pits, vault toilets and drinking water. No showers are available in this area. Camping fee is \$15.00 per person and checks should be made payable to The Sea Divers.

WHAT TO BRING: Camping gear, cooking utensils, warm clothing for the evening, full dive gear, firewood, hiking boots, abalone iron (to move gravel in your search for jade), small dive light, and as many tanks as you would like to dive with. The nearest air station is 55 miles south in Cayucos at Bill's Sporting Goods. There are small stores in Gorda or 2 miles north of the campground for ice, gas, etc. Word of warning: gas is expensive in Gorda.

DIVING HISTORY

THE FIRST AQUALUNG - 50 YEARS OLD

Modern diving, or diving as we know it today, began in early 1943 -- 50 years ago!! The full flow regulator controlled by a simple pressurized tank valve was invented by Yves Le Prieur in 1933. Jacques-Yves Cousteau and Phillipe Tailliez dived with this system until Cousteau and Emil Gagnon invented the "demand regulator" in early 1943. The Cousteau-Gagnon regulator was an outgrowth of a demand valve designed by Gagnon for automobiles to use cooking gas in lieu of gasoline during the German occupation in the early part of WW II. Cousteau initially tested the new aqualung in the Marne River, culminating with a dive in a small sheltered cave near Bandol on the French Riviera with wife Simone and Frederic Dumas. Dumas later dove to just over 203 feet in October 1943 followed by a Cousteau dive to 210 feet shortly afterwards. Deeper dives continued until the death of Maurice Fargues in 1967 while attempting a dive to almost 400 feet.

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
BOUILLABAISSE TIME ALREADY?

13 JUNE - VETERAN'S PARK, REDONDO BEACH

DIVING - REFRESHER COURSE - BOUILLABAISSE COOKOUT/POTLUCK

We will dive just south of the pier at Redondo adjacent to Veteran's Park. For those unfamiliar with the dive site, it offers an easy sandy beach entry. The surf is typically small due to the Redondo Canyon at this location. Following a sloping sand bottom, the diver encounters the old Redondo Pier pilings about 50 feet out. They stand above the sand bottom reaching 10 feet and more toward the surface. Their long submersion leaves them covered with red corinactus and hollowed out havens for crabs. Continuing further, the pilings end in about 80 feet of water over the edge of the Redondo Canyon. Anyone requiring a short "refresher" in diving should contact Ken Sizemore for appropriate arrangements. Park in the Redondo Beach Municipal parking lot on the south side of Veteran's Park at 25 cents an hour (so bring quarters!!!).

Grande Master Chef Parker will be stirring up a warm and filling pot of bouillabaisse that is guaranteed to satisfy the most discriminating diver. "Le Chef" asks all who plan to partake of this tasty concoction to BRING SEAFOOD, CAUGHT OR BOUGHT, TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE POT. A Day of Diving, Fun, and Support of a Very Worthy Cause Wednesday, May 19, has been selected as the date for Chamber Day '93, the fifth annual fund raiser to benefit the hyperbaric chamber operating at the Isthmus on Catalina Island. Last year, over 400 divers participated raising almost \$15,000 for the Chamber. Organizers anticipate an even bigger turn out this year. Hyperbaric chambers are the only means of treating embolism

and bends, two life-threatening maladies that can affect divers. Because of the high amount of diving done in Southern California, the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber is very active. And even though Los Angeles County funds one-third of the chamber's costs, the fact is that two-thirds of the chamber's budget must

come from other sources.

BEACH DIVE POLICY


A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming overnight (i.e., campsites, etc.) beach dive as follows:

- a) UNCONFIRMED reservations may be made for any beach dive at any time. To CONFIRM a reservation, full payment must be received by the key contact for the specific dive.
- b) Divers holding an UNCONFIRMED reservation will be called 6 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 4 weeks prior to the dive to be confirmed.
- c) If payment in full is not received by the 4 week deadline, the diver will be dropped from the dive.

Any reservation may be cancelled 4 weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within 4 weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another person. The dive key contact will assist in the process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the key contact that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another person, the replacement is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

All reservations, payments, cancellations, etc., must be made through the key contact for the specific beach dive. Key contacts are lilsted in the newslsetter.

All confirmed and unconfirmed reservations are considered as bona fide commitments to the dive.



THE SEA DIVERS' INTERIM NITROX POLICY

The following is The Sea Divers' interim use of Nitrox policy. This policy will be updated as we gain further training and/or insight into the use of Nitrox.

- 1) Nitrox may only be used as a separate and fully independent system supplement to a normal air supply. Use of Nitrox only is not allowed under this interim policy.
- Diver must show proof of Nitrox use certification and specific Nitrox mix to the divemsster.
- Diver must be an advanced diver and a club member.
- 4) Diver must not exceed 1.6 ATA oxygen (i.e., 132 feet) while carrying Nitrox I (32% oxygen), or 114 feet while carrying Nitrox II (36% oxygen).
- 5) Depth and bottom time limits must be based on AIR ONLY calculations using computers, Navy tables, etc. This is per Application 1, page 71/72 of the ANDI Manual.
- 6) Diver must log actual depth and bottom times with the diversater upon return to the boat (or beach).
- 7) This policy may be be overruled by specific boat restrictions.
- 8) Divers must sign a waiver releasing The Sea Divers from liability.

Wild Wave - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the mini-traffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive; go to the left on to Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.

 B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full in confirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full in confirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full in confirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full must be received.
- in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.

 C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.

D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only Sea Diver club members and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.
