A WHALE OF A TALE . . . OR ORDNANCE AMATEURS AT WORK!

The Farside comes to life in Oregon.

I am absolutely not making this incident up; in fact I have it all on videotape. The tape is from a local TV news show in Oregon, which sent a reporter out to cover the removal of a 45-foot, 8-ton dead whale that washed up on the beach. The planned itinerary for this our first two-day of 1994 will take us out to San Miguel Island — as always, weather permitting. Our first dive spot will be on the east side of the Santa Cruz Channel, hopefully on one of the abalone spots. We will then cruise over to the west (Santa Rosa) side and pick a good scallop and/or abalone area and then loop around either the north or south side of Santa Rosa picking off one dive either on the northwest tip (fish and scallops) or the southwest tip (fish and abalone).

We then hope to cross the San Miguel Passage onto the south side of San Miguel diving Crook Point and/or Wyckoff Ledge. We then plan to circle back around the east side of the island for one more dive before overnighting in Cuyler Harbor.

Weather permitting we would hope to tackle one of the major pinnacles (Wilson or Richardson); failing that, we will dive the lee side of Prince Island. We will then begin the run back to the mainland stopping for dives along the north side of either Santa Rosa or Santa Cruz.

This two-day will provide excellent opportunities for game (fish, abalone, scallops) and all kinds of photogenic sea life. Overall there will be dives for all skill levels — although the pinnacles are strong intermediate to advanced dives in all but near perfect conditions.

Needless to say the PEACE is a great boat just be on -- diving or not!! Call Kathi (McNally) at (310) 370-1657 for early sign-up and bunk assignment as you pay in full!!

Our second dive on the ENCORE this year is planned for the Pyramid Cove area on the southeast end of San Clemente Island. From 22nd Street we will head directly for Pyramid Head – named for the shape of the rock on the point. This area of San Clemente provides deep canyons with walls that drop as much as 100 feet. Thick lush kelp grows on the reef structures and the walls are full of red gorgonian, bright nudibranchs and other varieties of colorful invertebrates. Pyramid Cove is typically well protected from the prevailing seas and normally provides outstanding visbility. The many reef structures provide excellent opportunities for photography and video.

For the hunters, spear fishing is outstanding and on occasion, especially for you skin divers (you know -- like breath holding!!), schools of large yellowtail tease by. Working west towards China Point, abalone become plentiful and scallops can be found on most of the reefs in the area.

Almost in the center of Pyramid Cove there is a large arch — not well known. The arch is about 1/3 mile offshore and faces east/west. On the inside, depths are to 50 feet and on the outside increases rapidly to 100 feet. The oval-shaped arch is about 40 feet high and 15-20 feet across — quite spectacular, especially in clear water.

We then plan to work back towards the north on the frontside of San Clemente, picking off a dive or two in abalone areas -- typically greens and a few pinks. All in all, we plan four or five dives beginning in the Pyramid Cove area.

Remember our dives include air, food, beverages and snacks -- call Kathi (McNally) at (310) 370-1657 for sign-up. Bunks will be preassigned on a first PAID basis. GREAT TRIP!!



OOPS! - Where Did That Come From?

"Charisma" left the 22nd street dock at 6:00 a.m. Saturday 9 April under very ugly skies. A small front was passing through which had not been forecast until just before it arrived! Needless to say the road to Ship Rock was not flat. Skipper John H. was not optimistic about diving the Isthmus area and when we arrived conditions were certainly not perfect. However, John H. and crew managed to anchor "Charisma" on the north side of the pinnacle with the stern tied off to the rocks and the bow anchor in 120 feet of water.

The "Conception" tried several times to anchor on the south east side, holding up our diving for 15 minutes or so until they quit and left for calmer, shallower water. Once in the water, diving was surprisingly pleasant. There was little current and no surge. Visibility was 50 to 60 feet and temperature about 58°F - not bad for April. Depths were to 120 feet to the sandy bottom. Nice, nice, dive! Incidentally, the "Encore" also tried to anchor - while our divers were in the water (?), and failed four times. We then motored over to Emerald Cove to dive the Indian Rock pinnacles which are east of Indian Rock and rise to 40, 60 and 90 feet respectively. Once more this area was raging current time but in the opposite direction to 1993. In a way this was good, as one could work east across the pinnacles then drift (fly?) back to the boat. Unfortunately, several divers flew by the boat and were either picked up and towed back by Greg E. in a rubber duck from the "Golden Doubloon" or just managed to make the end of the long current line!

The third dive was on the Bird Rock extension reef towards the north. John H. anchored "Charisma" over the high spot at 25 feet. To the east the wall dropped to about 75-80 feet and on the west a more leisurely drop off to about 50-60 feet. Visibility was about 30 feet and there was no current (thank you!) and no surge to speak of. The fourth and final dive was at Gaggers just west and inside of Eagle Reef. The current had dropped noticeably which made for much more pleasant diving then dive number two earlier in the day. Other than current, conditions were much the same.


By now the sun was warm but it was still breezy and as we left the lee of the island, white caps set in. However, "Charisma" is not a real "small craft" so the run back was quite pleasant. As always, John H. and crew did a real nice job for us on a not so perfect weather day.


BOUILLABAISSE TIME ALREADY?

12 JUNE - VETERAN'S PARK, REDONDO BEACH

DIVING - REFRESHER COURSE - BOUILLABAISSE COOKOUT/POTLUCK

We will dive just south of the pier at Redondo adjacent to Veteran's Park. For those unfamiliar with the dive site, it offers an easy sandy beach entry. The surf is typically small due to the Redondo Canyon at this location. Following a sloping sand bottom, the diver encounters the old Redondo Pier pilings about 50 feet out. They stand above the sand bottom reaching 10 feet and more toward the surface. Their long submersion leaves them covered with red corinactus and hollowed out havens for crabs. Continuing further, the pilings end in about 80 feet of water over the edge of the Redondo Canyon. Anyone requiring a short "refresher" in diving should contact John Mowrey for appropriate arrangements. Park in the Redondo Beach Municipal parking lot on the south side of Veteran's Park at 25 cents an hour (so bring quarters!!!).

Grande Master Chef Parker will be stirring up a warm and filling pot of bouillabaisse that is guaranteed to satisfy the most discriminating diver. "Le Chef" asks all who plan to partake of this tasty concoction to BRING SEAFOOD, CAUGHT OR BOUGHT, TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE POT. 



UPDATE ON BAJA CALIFORNIA TRIP



We are firming up our plans for the 1994 La Paz / Cabo San Lucas trip. The tentative trip dates are now 24-30 August 1994. We plan to travel to La Paz on the 24th; dive on the 25th, 26th, 27th and 28th (optional). At this point you can either return to L.A. on the 28th (no diving!) or the 29th, or move on overland to Cabo San Lucas for the nights of the 28th and 29th, with an optional dive day on the 29th. We will plan a late departure for L.A. on the 30th.





Wednesday, May 4, has been selected as the date for Chamber Day '94, the sixth annual fund raiser to benefit the hyperbaric chamber operating at the Isthmus on Catalina Island.

Hyperbaric chambers are the only means of treating embolism and bends, two life-threatening maladies that can affect divers. Because of the high amount of diving done in Southern California, the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber is very active. And even though Los Angeles County funds one-third of the chamber's costs, the fact is that two-thirds of the chamber's budget must come from other sources.

Chamber Day was conceived as a way for recreational divers to have fun diving and make a financial contribution to the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber at the same time. The dive-charter boats operating out of Southern California donate their time and services for the day, and divers pay to dive aboat one of the participating boats. The divers get a chance to dive Catalina for the day and also get a walking tour of the chamber facilities along with a commemorative "Chamber Day "94" t-shirt. A raffle prize drawing for major pieces of dive equipment will also be conducted. All the money raised from the event goes to support the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber.

Wild Wave - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the mini-traffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive; go to the left on to Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received. A) B)
- For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full C) is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.

If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only Sea Diver club members and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.
