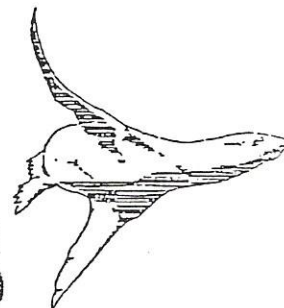

A DOUBLE FEATURE FROM AVALON AQUATICS

SUB BASE CATALINA!

David Frost (or John Council) will tell us how we can now enter a new realm of underwater experience with the Sea Urchin. The Sea Urchin is a dry, one-atmosphere submersible that can descend to 300 ft for 5-10 hours. That means no decompression! You can learn to pilot this sub at the new Sub Base Catalina starting July 1, 1994 in Avalon, Catalina. Once trained, you can rent time on the sub or go on future advanced dives to deep wreck sites and photography missions. The Sea Urchin will also be available in Key Largo, Florida this fall and future sites will be opening up in other hot dive locations.

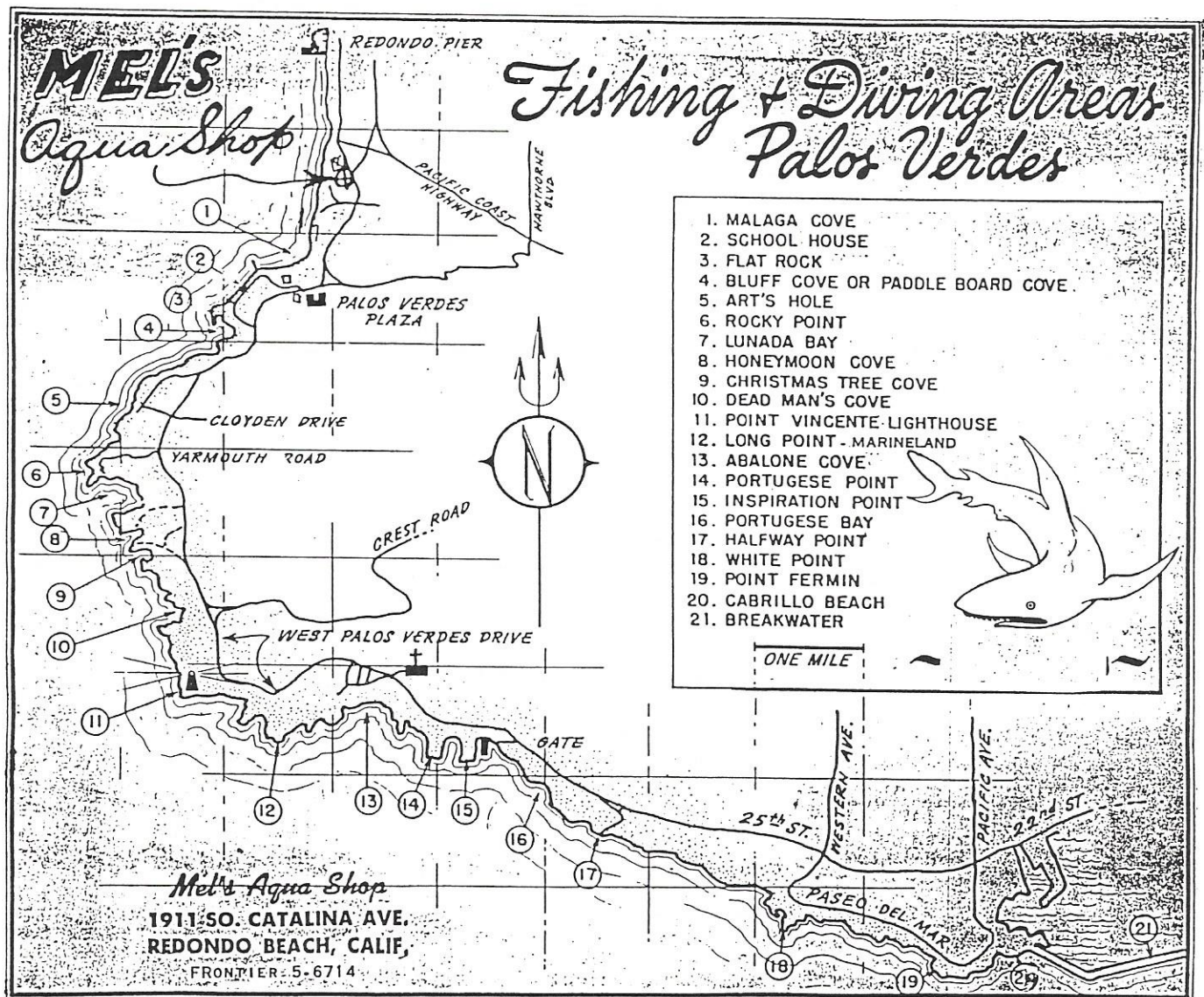
MORE CATALINA!!

DIVING HISTORY

The "chart" on this page was obtained from Jocko at Dive N' Surf. The "chart" is circa 1960 and was produced by Mel's (as in Mel Fisher) Aqua Shop which is now Sea D' Sea. Mel Fisher also owned the "Golden Doubloon" (hence the name!) in the same time frame and along with other escapades removed one or more of the props from the wreck of the "Valiant" off Descanso Beach near Avalon.

Note that on the "chart" Hawthorne Blvd. is not connected and part of it was named Crest Road. Dive spots named are still popular today, although not so endowed with sea life especially abalone and scallops. Also note that the chart was prior to the "Dominator" wreck and the subsequent sinking of the "Avalon" one of our planned dives in August.

Our second two-day dive of 1994 is a great southern outer island cruise and dive to the very best spots. This Friday/ Saturday affair has all the makings of a really outstanding trip! The CHARISMA is berthed at 22nd Street in San Pedro and is 78 feet long, 25 feet wide, has 7 staterooms, a 36-seat galley, freezer, large sun deck, and color TV/VCR.

Begg Rock is a group of pinnacles which rise about 15 feet above water and then plunge in the most spectacular fashion to over 100' with rolling ledges from 30' to 60'. The rock is located about 7 miles north of San Nicolas Island, and is noted for its huge plate-sized scallops on the deeper ledges (easy to limit out at the one-day limit of 10). Photophiles and video buffs will be well served. Relative beginners should note that Begg Rock is fully exposed to the ocean, but on good days may be dived by all skill levels after appropriate pre-dive consultation with The Sea Divers' dive masters and a properly planned dive.

San Nicolas, the outer most of the southern islands, is noted for its relative remoteness and typically large size game. Ocean temperatures are high (50-60 degrees F) like last year, making diving very pleasant. Divers should also have no problem reaching the limit on abalone (pinks, greens and/or reds). Large fish, such as Calico Bass, Sheephead, etc., can be found in the kelp beds and reefs. You won't come home empty handed! We will overnight at San Nicolas, probably at Dutch Harbor, with full dinner, and a modicum of wine, for those interested, socialize with good friends and enjoy a typically great evening, just relaxing. The following day we will either head for Begg Rock for our second attempt, or cruise to Santa Barbara Island, which is the smallest, prettiest island, and has a little of everything. The spectacular underwater arches, walls, reefs, sea lions, and other sea life are great for photography and video and visibility is usually exceptional. You should be able to complete your second day abalone limit at Santa Barbara -- mostly pinks, greens and a smattering of whites and reds. Again, large fish surround the area, including the occasional black sea bass (these are for viewing only!!!).

In our established two-day tradition, goodies, prizes and/or awards will be featured during this trip. Sign up early to make sure you have a spot on this charter. Bunks will be preassigned on a FIRST PAID basis. Call Kathi (McNally) at (310) 370-1657 for sign up. Boarding begins at 7:00 PM on Thursday, 21 July, and everyone should be on board by 11:00 PM. 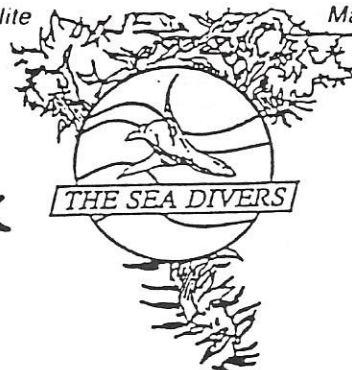

AN ALMOST PERFECT DAY

"Encore" left the 22nd street dock at about 1:15 a.m. to a flat smooth run to Pyramid Head on the southeast tip of San Clemente Island. The anchor dropped at 6:45 a.m. after a fairly quick 5 1/2 hour run.

The first dive was on a pinnacle-like structure just to the east of the "pyramid". Depths were from 30 feet, just behind the boat, to about 95 feet on the sand bottom. In between were many mini-canyons, ledges and walls to enjoy. Water temperature was 55°F at depth and close to 60°F at the surface. There was no current, no surge - calm!! These conditions essentially remained unchanged throughout the day. Visibility was spectacular. I could see the boat from 95 feet!!

The second spot was in the center of Pyramid Cove. This time the ledges and mini-canyons were in the shallower 45 foot depths and the deeper areas to 85 feet were made up of piles of volcanic rocks down again to the sand. The third dive was in similar topography, just east of the "Inside Boilers" - they were not boiling. Nor were the just west "Outside Boilers" where we anchored for the fourth (and fifth if you were fast) dive. At both spots, visibility decreased slightly to maybe 60 feet and depths varied between 25 feet and 60 feet.

One major surprise for us all was that the whole area was devoid of medium to large fish of all varieties. Pyramid is not known for large quantities of scallops or abalone but is noted for large fish and lobster. There were lots of undersize lobster. "So where have all the fishes gone?" Interesting question.

We left the island under a hot sun at 1:15 p.m. and it didn't take a rocket scientist to figure out 6:45 p.m. at the dock (see times above!) after another 5 1/2 hour run.

We didn't have any worthwhile boobies except my dive computer which told me I was dead after the second dive!! I did get a major day in the sun as a result. As the heading says it was an almost perfect day.

BAJA CALIFORNIA TRIP COST



We are firming up our plans for the 1994 La Paz / Cabo San Lucas trip. The tentative trip dates are now 24-30 August 1994. We plan to travel to La Paz on the 24th; dive on the 25th, 26th, 27th and 28th (optional). At this point you can either return to L.A. on the 28th (no diving!) or the 29th, or move on overland to Cabo San Lucas for the nights of the 28th and 29th, with an optional dive day on the 29th. We will plan a late departure for L.A. on the 30th.

The La Paz only portion including airfare, 4 nights (double occupancy) at La Concha, 3 days/3 tank diving will cost approximately \$635 for divers. Non-diver cost will be approximately \$370. La Paz add-ons are \$38.50 per night (double occupancy) and \$60 (2 tank) or \$89 (3 tank) for dive days. The Cabo San Lucas portion for 2 nights (double occupancy at Sol Mar), 1 day/2 tank dive, transfer from La Paz will cost an additional \$194 for divers and \$134 for non-divers. Air fares are subject to change and there may be a slight increase for flying into La Paz and out of Los Cabos. We need to get a firm headcount and book early to get the best prices, so if you are interested, call Kathi or Allen at (310) 370-1657.



JADE COVE CAMPOUT

1-5 JULY 1994

Jade Cove is 40 miles south of Monterey and 30 miles north of San Simeon. It is noted for chunks of nephrite jade at and below the water line. It is real jade!! Once you find a nice size specimen, jade fever usually takes over. And, you can have three days to find some!

DIRECTIONS: It is approximately 5-6 hours driving time from the South Bay area to Jade Cove. Go north on 101 thru Santa Barbara to San Luis Obispo. Exit at the Hwy. 1 offramp for Morro Bay and head north to San Simeon. Twenty-nine miles past San Simeon you will pass through a very small town called Gorda. Look for the Plaskett Creek campground sign on the east side of Hwy. 1 about 2-1/2 to 3 miles north of Gorda.

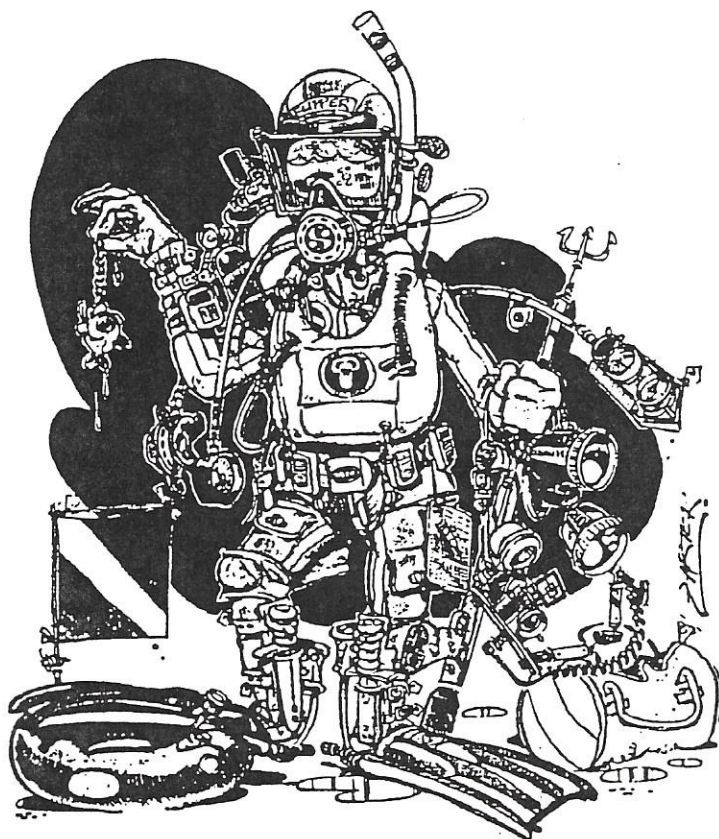
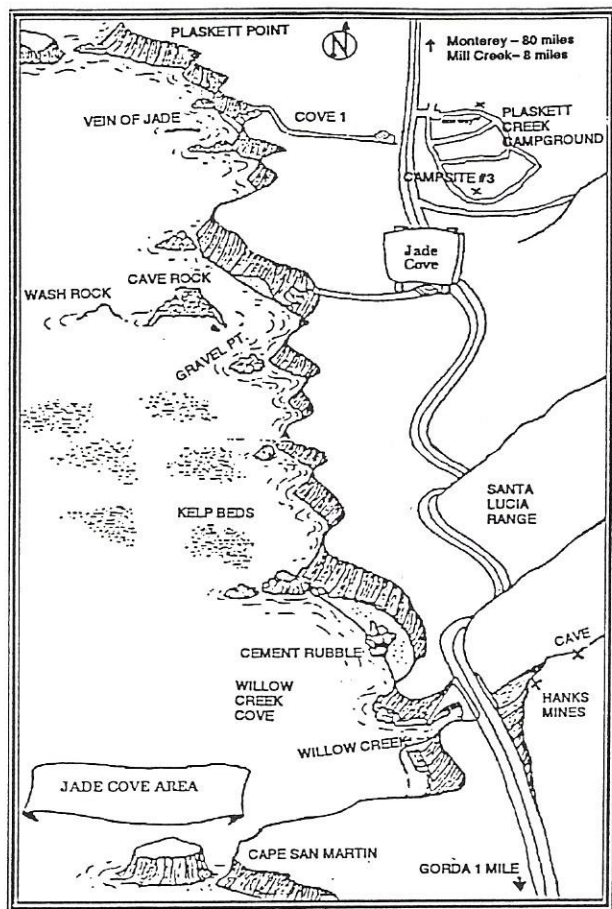
WHAT TO DO: The diving at Jade Cove is noted for its beauty in addition to its gems. There are large lingcod and other rock fish for the gamesman. Usually there is a thick kelp bed to cope with and conditions can be quite variable. The hike to the beach is through 100 yards of meadowland and down a 150' cliff along a steep switch-back dirt trail. For those not wanting to cope with the cliff, several miles north is Willow Creek where you can drive down to the beach. It is a sandy beach entry with rocky patches out further that are great for the photographer and the browser. There are other things to do besides diving -- hiking, photography, bird watching, volleyball, catching up on R&R, and meeting fellow club members.

Monterey/Pt. Lobos is a one hour drive north on Hwy. 1. Reservations to dive Pt. Lobos must be made no earlier than one month in advance. If you are interested, contact Cathy Gale.

CAMPSITE & FEES: The club has reserved group campsite #3 on the southwest end of the campground. It can accommodate 50 people and 8 parking slots. The campsite is designed for tents and there are tables, fire pits, vault toilets and drinking water. No showers are available in this area. Camping fee is \$15.00 per person and checks should be made payable to The Sea Divers.

WHAT TO BRING: Camping gear, cooking utensils, warm clothing for the evening, full dive gear, firewood, hiking boots, abalone iron (to move gravel in your search for jade), small dive light, and as many tanks as you would like to dive with. The nearest air station is 55 miles south in Cayucos at Bill's Sporting Goods. There are small stores in Gorda or 1 mile north of the campground for ice, gas, etc. Word of warning: gas is expensive in Gorda.

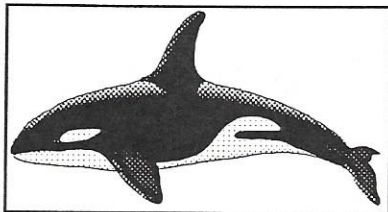

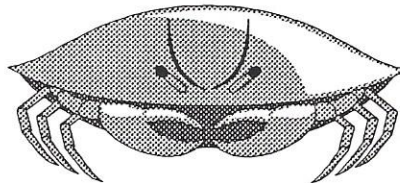

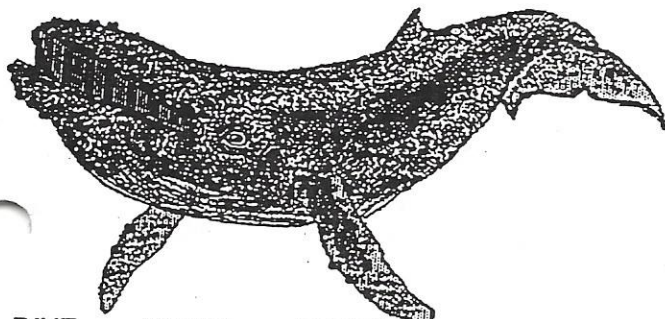

- Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the mini-traffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive; go to the left on to Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only Sea Diver club members and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.
