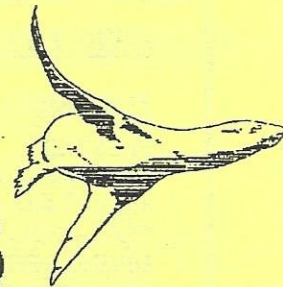

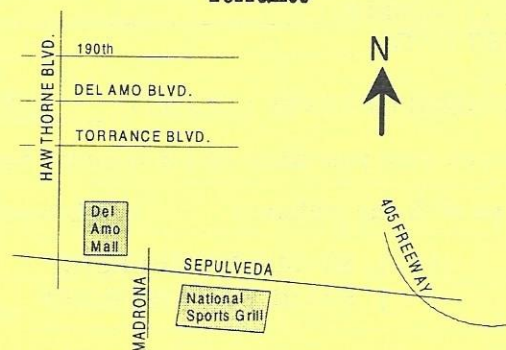
California Abalones: Their Biology, Fisheries, and Future

California has now closed four species of abalone to sport and commercial harvest. What are the time frames needed to effect a recovery of the abalone resources, and how can those resources be conserved in the future? These topics and their relationship to abalone biology will be discussed during a slide presentation by Pete Haaker, an Associate Marine Biologist with the Department of Fish and Game. Pete is the Project Leader of the Nearshore Invertebrate Evaluation Project working out of Long Beach and is currently concerned with abalone and sea urchins. Pete is also a NAUI Instructor, and a member of the Fish and Game Diving Safety Board which governs about 70 Department Divers. In addition to our speaker there will be a special auction at this months meeting. See page 5 for the details.

The 1995/96 lobster season is drawing to a close, the 1996 abalone season opens 1 March 1996. The mighty/flighty Joel Ingram will be at the helm of the *Atlantis*, now a knot or so faster after Joel's makeover. We'll be searching once more for the elusive and wily bugs. The weather has been quite good this year and we hope to get to the island in the early (still dark) timeframe to get in one night and three or four daylight dives. Those interested should bring fresh chem lights and at least one dive light. Red abalone, are also fairly abundant in some spots around San Nicolas and they don't move nearly so fast as those bugs do!! But you need to recognize the various species however, so you don't violate the new sport fishing regulations - only reds are legal this season.

For those of us that are not so lucky or skilled at the lobster or abalone stakes, fish provide a nice alternative with many different species to spear. Although not the prettiest underwater environment, San Nicolas can provide excellent opportunities for video or photography. The boat will depart at 11:00 p.m. on Saturday.

Diving around San Nicolas is suitable for all skill levels with ocean cooperation. Relative beginners should check with The Sea Divers' divemaster on duty before making a deep or potentially difficult dive. Call Kathy (Kalohi) at (310) 719-1816 for sign-ups and additional information. Bunks will be preassigned on a first pay/space available basis.

The mighty *Charisma* will take us from 22nd Street to several of the pinnacles on the front side of Catalina. Ship Rock guards the approach to Isthmus Cove and aside from two shallow ledges astride the spine drops steeply to the sand close to 120 feet. Current can be a factor diving the pinnacle and is responsible for the typically high visibility in the area. The rock attracts a tremendous variety of sea life from the gorgonia fans and the deeper octorals to yellowtail and the predator fish to large angel sharks in the sand. One of the best dives around for video, photography, or just looking.

Following the Ship Rock dive, we will move to one or two of the pinnacles toward the West End. Eagle Rock, Indian Rock, and the adjacent three pinnacles are likely candidates. For our last dive we will return to the Isthmus area to Bird Rock just to the SSE of Ship Rock. This will provide an opportunity to dive the north flat face which contains a vertical 60 foot wall and adjacent up to 90 foot deep kelp forests - another excellent dive. These are all spectacular dives and as choice of depth can be planned into your dives, they can typically be dived by all skill levels. High current, a feature last year, obviously increased the skill level requirements. Although not as abundant as on the other islands, scallops and fish are available for the persistent gamesperson.

As on most Sea Diver's charters, the trip includes air, food, snacks, and beverages. Call Kathy Kalohi at (310) 719-1816 for sign-up. Come along - check out our all inclusive price against anyone!!

Oh Ye, Faint of Heart!!

Our first dive of 1996 was on *Charisma* to the backside of San Clemente. Two fronts accompanied with rain were supposed to pass through late Friday into Saturday and the second wave sometime Sunday - our dive day. There was no forecast for significant winds. Rain doesn't make waves, wind does!! Anyhow, the phone calls started early Saturday and to cut a long story short we had eight no-shows.

Sunday dawned clear and bright, with a few thin streaks of clouds. The ocean was flat. In fact the day was just beautiful - no wind, very warm sun - "Oh Ye, Faint of Heart"!!!

On to diving. Our first dive was at the four and a half fathom spot just west of Seal Cove. Nice dive with depths to 85 feet 58°F temperature and 60 to 80 feet visibility. Bugs were there with only a few legals to play with. John H. then attempted to move in closer to the backside shoreline, however once in less than 45 feet of water or so, green set in. We finished up near the West End just off the backside. Nice dive with lots of crevices for bugs. We found the kindergarten, and grades one through seven, but no "active" teenagers or adults. Grandpa and grandma were nowhere around! Our third dive was just north and west of Northwest Harbor, a spot similar to dive two. Both spots had 59°F water, 60 feet or so visibility and depths to 50 or 60 feet. The final and fourth dive was off Koka Point again in clear relatively warm (for this time of year) water. Throughout it was calm.

For the cruise home the sun was very warm - good for early season tanning and quite a few were up on the "veranda" (a.k.a. sun-deck) doing just that. As we left the east end of Catalina a slight breeze came up but it remained essentially flat all the way. We had no strong contenders for booby prizes, except the club President and Vice President who were both diving after being sick on and off for over a month!! But it was such a nice day for diving and cruising.

"King size beds are too big. You get lost unless there's four of you."

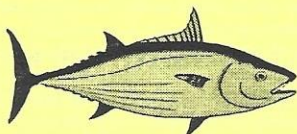
"I'm getting too old for this."

CORRECTION!!!

(Editor's note: The Fish and Game regulation change announcement in last month's newsletter was printed with an incorrect date. The following is the full text of the article from the GLACD newsletter.)

ABALONE CLOSURE

Green and white abalone have been closed to harvest effective March 1, 1996 for two years. The Fish and Game Commission voted at its last meeting in Sacramento to close both the sport and commercial harvest of green and white abalone. Pink abalone will also be closed for a two year period, but with the provision the Fish and Game Department should do a study and come back to the Commission within six months to determine if there should be an exception for this species. At an earlier Commission hearing commercial abalone dives maintained the pink populations were still healthy and the Department just didn't know where to look when assessing the species. A detailed survey should lay to rest once and for all the status of the health of the pink abalones.

Just remember, from here on out ONLY REDS MAY BE TAKEN. How much longer this species will remain healthy enough to be harvested is anyone's guess.

California Chamber Day '96 — May 1

Wednesday, May 1, has been selected as the date for California Chamber Day '96, the eighth annual fund raiser to benefit two of the hyperbaric chamber programs operating in Southern California.

Hyperbaric chambers are the only means of treating embolism and bends, life-threatening maladies that can affect divers. Because of the high amount of diving done in Southern California, the Catalina and Los Robles Hyperbaric Chambers are very active. And even though Los Angeles County funds one-third of the Catalina's Hyperbaric Chamber's costs, two-thirds of the chamber's budget must come from other sources. The Los Robles Chamber is privately operated, but divers needing the chamber are often uninsured for hyperbaric treatment.

Chamber Day was conceived as a way for recreational divers to have fun diving while at the same time making a financial contribution to the uninsured diver's fund for the Los Robles Chamber and support operations of the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber. The dive-charter boats operating out of Southern California donate their time and services for the day, and divers pay to dive aboard one of the participating boats. The divers get a chance to dive Catalina Island or the Northern Channel Islands for the day and Catalina visitors also get a walking tour of the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber facilities. Participants also receive a commemorative "Chamber Day '96" t-shirt. A raffle prize drawing for major pieces of dive equipment will also be conducted. All the money raised from the event goes to support the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber or into the Los Robles Chamber uninsured diver fund.

Chamber Day '96 will cost \$65, which includes a day of diving and the commemorative t-shirt. To sign up for the event, call (800) 348-3794. Requests to be on a specific boat can be made at sign up.

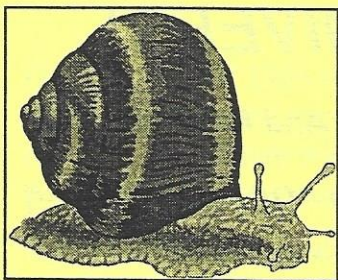
What Do Your Dues Pay For?

We have been asked several times about introducing another level of dues for club members who dive infrequently or not at all.

Essentially your annual dues pay for the running of the club - NOT the dive boats. Our primary outlay is about \$1.25 per copy for printing each newsletter and \$0.32 or \$0.52 apiece for mailing them each month. Other outlays are for other communications within the dive community, the IRS and related costs and some contributions to our small beach dive program.

The \$10 and \$15 difference on dive boats for non-club members is our way of making a few extra bucks from non-members, NOT a "cut" for members who are boat diving.

Dear L⁴,

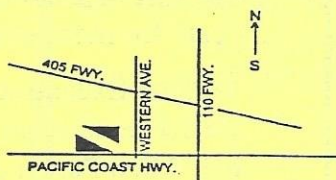

Atlantis - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the mini-traffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks.

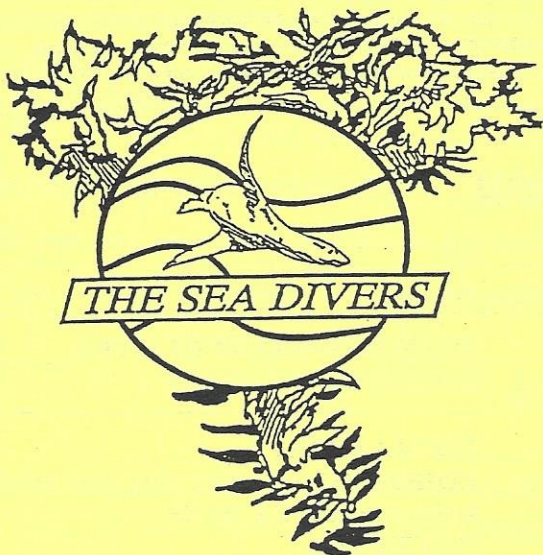
