

Could we, can we, please let's repeat the May success on *Peace* to one or more of the San Miguel major pinnacles. In May we made Richardson's, a first for even some of our older members. Weather was outstanding!

Our basic plan is to head for the west end of Santa Rosa check out the channel conditions and if possible make San Miguel. We'll attempt dives at some of the good spots Cardwell Point, Crook Point, Wyckoff Ledge, Tyler Bight, Judith Rock, Richardson's Rock, Castle Rock, Symington Cove and Wilson Rock weather and dive profiles permitting. Most of the dives will be on the first full day with three or four dives on the second day. San Miguel is great for photography and video. Looky loos will also enjoy the great underwater topography and sea life. Red abalone are still available in relatively large numbers (limit of two per day) as are scallops (limit of ten per day) on the pinnacles. Large fish of all varieties also cruise the area.

Peace trips are always excellent, no matter what, so sign-up early by calling Kathy (Kalohi) at (310) 719-1816. When you pay in full your favorite bunk will be pre-assigned, adding to your trip pleasure! GREAT STUFF.

For the first time in a couple of years we are going to go to Cortes Bank for some world class diving. Based on our track record the last year or so the odds are excellent that we'll not only make it there but that conditions will be outstanding. In the last 12 months The Sea Diver charters have made ALL of Southern California's major pinnacle dives at least once, some numerous times!

Cortes Bank is located about 80 miles SSW of 22nd Street Landing and about 40 miles SW of China Point on San Clemente Island and is almost directly west of San Diego. As it is an exposed dive spot, 'The Bank' has not been dived as much as some of the closer in areas. Diving depths range from 20 to 120 feet, providing generally excellent game taking possibilities. Lobster in particular have been abundant and the various reefs making up 'The Bank' are home to many species of good sized fish. Photo and video buffs will not be disappointed. We are on the *Encore* and should be anchored by about 7:00 a.m. for our first dive. Our "fallback" and our "overnight" will be on the backside of San Clemente Island which also has great dive spots, especially on the backside.

This dive is generally considered an intermediate to advanced dive due to Cortes Bank's full exposure to the ocean. However, relative beginners can make the dives, assuming that ocean conditions relative to surge and/or current are within acceptable limits. San Clemente is suitable for all skill levels. The Sea Divers divemasters should be consulted based on your dive plan and/or experience.

This is an outstanding dive area. There are few chances to ever dive Cortes...and if you've ever dove the area, you'll never forget it. A truly world class dive. So come on out and help support the club and dive one of the best spots you'll ever see. Call Kathy (Kalohi) at (310) 719-1816 for sign-up and when you pay in full your favorite bunk will be pre-assigned, adding to your trip pleasure!. Boarding will begin at 7:00 PM on the 1st of November and leave promptly at 11:00 PM.

BEGG ROCK TIMES TWO TIMES TWO EQUALS FOUR

So here we are Thursday AM twelve hours or so before our planned *Charisma* two day to Begg Rock and San Nicolas. The L.A. Times has a great front page color photo of a surfer down at Newport Beach getting some very serious air time after being 'thrown' by a fifteen foot wave! Holy SCUBA!! What kind of trip is this to be - two days at Catalina?!?! Not so as it turns out.

We arrived at Begg Rock about 7:00 AM on the first day (Friday). Seas were calm with slight swells washing around the two lower pinnacles. John H. circled the rock several times before electing our anchor point south and east of the center pinnacle. Visibility was 40-50 feet with no current and a slight surge to 60 feet or so. Large scallops were surprisingly available at 60 to 80 feet. Water temperature was a comfortable 64°F. We elected a second dive, keeping the gates closed for about one and one-half hours. The second dive was cut short, for some, as *Charisma* started drifting towards the rocks as the wind changed direction. The recall worked well except for those on the anchor line who persisted in hanging on thinking this was an OK holding pattern!!!

We moved into San Nicolas at the West End making three dives in similar environs. One off the mid-point of the West End, one at The Hell Hole about two miles east of the northwest tip and one in the "foul area" close to the third dive spot. Water was 65°F, visibility 30-40 feet with no current and barely perceptible surge. Depths were typically in the 35 to 50 feet region. Abalone there was NOT!!! Dive six (and any potential night dive) was at our overnight anchorage on the northeast side of the island. Conditions were much the same as dives three thru five, with no surge whatsoever. The prime rib dinner was excellent, followed by a movie or two or bunk time.

At 5:30 AM engines were up and running and we were 'heading out'. Begg Rock for a second day? Right on! John H. was working on his reputation and we were right in tune with his approach! The sea around Begg was glassy, our anchor was on the shoulder which falls away to depth rapidly. Again scallops were relatively large and easy. Photographic possibilities were everywhere. Between dives John H. moved to another spot - the best, with ridges, mini-canyons, peaks, all around the sea life was just incredible. One does not make Begg Rock easily but it's always outstanding when one makes it!


Should also mention the skin diving / snorkeling which is gaining popularity. Dave G., Joe K., and skipper John H. all tried their hand with appropriate equipment for fish hunting. All scored!!! Joe K. came away with a 26 and 12 pound pair of white sea bass and Dave G. two and John H. one white sea bass respectively at around 10-12 pounds each. Not bad. As mentioned above the photographers were in hog heaven - hope to see some of their results at one of our General Meetings.

We left Begg Rock just after 11:00 AM for the seven hour run back which was pleasant under somewhat hazy skies. Under anyone's imagination Begg seemed out of the question Thursday, but as is often the case, we were fortunately wrong. Great trip most of you missed!!!

LA PAZ AND PUNTA PESCADERO UPDATE

The club has planned the now almost annual trip to Baja Mexico 24 through 30 September 1996. This year we will spend three nights at La Concha in La Paz and three nights at the Hotel Punta Pescadero which is exactly halfway between La Paz and Cabo San Lucas. We will have two days of diving from La Paz and an open itinerary (i.e. diving, fishing, snorkeling, or just kick back) in Punta Pescadero. Total cost of the trip for divers is about \$730 and about \$543 for non-divers. This includes round-trip air fare, hotels, transfers (including round trip from La Paz to Punta Pescadero), and two day of two tank diving (extra tank can be added for \$10 each) at La Paz. 

CHARISMA SOLD


The *Charisma* had been up for sale for some time. It was recently purchased by the owner of the *Atlantis*, who plans to run both boats. Initially, *Charisma* (to be renamed) will stay at the present dock. Pam (of the *Encore*) will be skippering both the ex-*Charisma* and the *Atlantis* as needed with Kenny H. running the *Encore*. Other crew arrangements are unknown. Some charters for 1996 will roll over onto available *Encore* dates/charters, the remainder are 'to be determined'. One of The Sea Divers remaining charters this year is on the *Encore*, a two day affair to Cortes Bank. What of 1997? Too early to tell, stand by for more!!

1996 SCHEDULE

We cancelled the Friday 11 October 1996 charter with *Atlantis*, probably saving the club treasury! Our remaining three dives for 1996 are all two days, *Peace* twice, in September and November/December, and *Encore* once in October. Atlantis - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the minitraffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks
