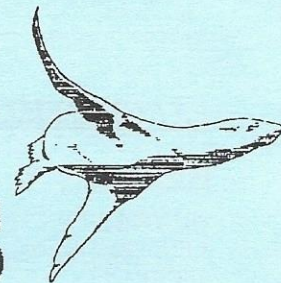

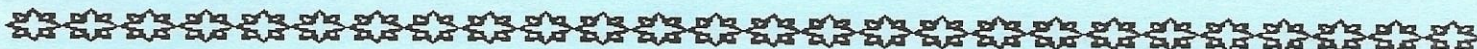


IN AFFILIATION WITH AMERICAN DIVING

SEPTEMBER GENERAL MEETING: PETER LANDECKER - DIVING IN THAILAND

At our September General Meeting our very own Program Chairperson, Peter Landecker, will show a video he took while diving out of Phuket, Thailand earlier this year. Peter has been diving since 1975 and has logged over 1000 hours underwater in 28 countries (see www.geocities.com/plandecker/index.html#Scuba)

After a delightful 18 day northern Thailand land excursion, Peter extended the trip a week so he could dive on a liveaboard to the Surin Archipelago (in southern Thailand but north of Phuket).

Dive sites at this Archipelago included Koh Bon, Koh Tachai, the Surin Islands together with Richelieu Rock. Andaman Scuba's (www.andamanscuba.com) five night program first passes by the deserted island of Koh Bon and its breathtaking drop-off. Then Koh Tachai, further north, with its reef in the middle of the sea, covered with granite boulders, sea fans and large school of pelagics. The Surin Islands offer a large number of dive sites with coral garden, fields of granite boulders and a wide and rich amount of fish and coral species. Richelieu Rock, named after a so-called Captain hit the rock, has enough to show to do several dives there. Sand sharks (leopard, nurse), sting rays and other pelagics such as barracuda, tuna, mackerel were sighted as well as a cuttle fish ménage-a-trois. The bottom topography is interesting: huge granite boulders covered with coral, providing lots of exciting swim-throughs, canyons, and caves.

Peter used his Sony Hi-8 camcorder in an Ikelite housing to capture beautiful underwater scenes. So come to the next TSD meeting and enjoy his relating his trip experiences (some good, and some not so good).

Our next General Meeting is on Tuesday 3 September at Round Table Pizza in Hawthorne starting at 7:00 PM.

PLANNED THE DIVE, DIVED THE PLAN

Our August single day dive was planned nearly a year ago to the wreck of the *USS Moody* and oil rig *Eureka*. Since 9/11 last year the rigs off Huntington Beach have banned diving. Fortunately, after a lot of work by Ken Kurtis, a new protocol was developed to allow oil rig diving once more. That was our plan!

We arrived over the *Moody* about 8:00 AM, in calm seas and a medium surface current. In general, *Moody* diving conditions don't get much better than this. Temperatures were from 68°F at the surface to the low 60°'s at depth and visibility to 35 feet. The contingent of California Wreck Divers on board succeeded in recovering several significant "treasures" including a voice tube with cover raised by Phil B. Note that Phil was diving with a rebreather! We completed two dives on the *Moody* before heading towards *Eureka*. The sun was out and bright.

After an attempted marine radio call, then a cell phone call, we finally contacted the rig. I had emailed them earlier in the week, then called 48 hours prior to the dive and given them all the required information. Quite the process but we finally got the OK. Conditions were excellent. Very slight current, small swells and 50-60 feet visibility. Temperature was in the high 60°'s. Depths to "whatever". Due to a slightly late start from the dock in the AM (not the boat's fault), we were on the edge for the fourth dive time-wise. As it was Sunday and most were "bottomed out" we elected to forgo the fourth dive and make a relatively early return to the dock. Worked out well!!

We gave out one booby to John F. for yet one more tank double gainer onto the deck. Seems like we have one of these on almost every trip. Strap in those tanks folks!!

Great day of diving, on a full boat (Thanks for that) and *Great Escape* and crew did an excellent job all around.

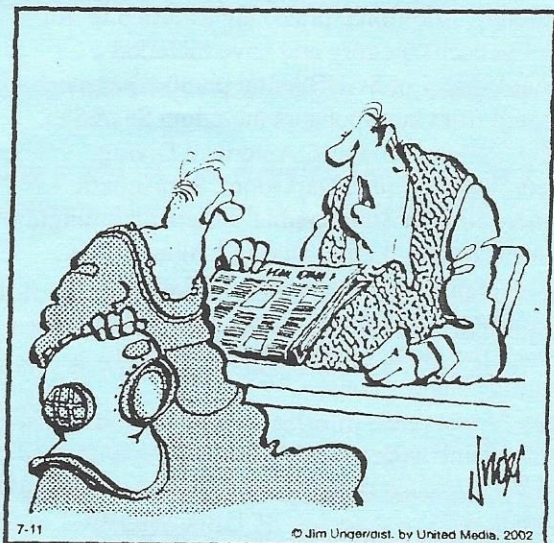

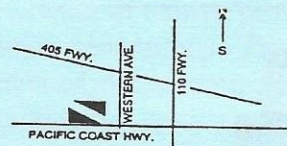

DIVING THE OIL RIGS AGAIN

It's with great joy that we can announce that we've brokered a deal (on behalf of the entire SoCal diving industry) to resume diving the oil rigs off of Huntington Beach. Reef Seekers co-owner, Ken Kurtis spent the latter part of June working out a deal with Aeraenergy (operators of the rigs), the U.S. Coast Guard, the Minerals Management Service (Dept. of the Interior), and the dive boat captains and other chartering groups.

For those of you who have dove the rigs before, there will be a few minor changes:

- ID check (C-card & driver's license)
- Bag check
- The boat will alert the rigs when we're diving
- On the surface, divers MUST be on the west side
- If you're on the "wrong" side, you'll need to drift 100 yards clear of the rig for pick-up

There's also one major change: no game-taking of any kind.

The reason for this is that Aera is very sensitive about trespassing, both above and below the waterline. They consider any physical contact you make with the rig to be trespassing, and consider the removal of any fish or shellfish (in this case, we're basically talking scallops) to be a violation of the "No Trespassing" edict. This doesn't seem to be a change in their policy. We just think it was something they didn't look at closely in the past but will re-emphasize now that we're doing a more structured arrangement.

Although we're certainly not known as a "hunting" store, we also realize that some of you do take game, and will be disappointed by the "no-take" rule. However, we feel it's a small price to pay for resumed access and part of the arrangement is that we'll periodically review the protocols, so perhaps in six months or so we can revisit the game issue.

Also, from a practical standpoint (and this concern was raised by one of our DMs), many of us do our 3-minute 15'; safety stop by grabbing on to the mussels that cover the rig at that depth. While that may indeed be a technical violation of the no trespassing clause (1) I don't think they'll care, and (2) you're not bringing up the evidence of your trespass with you, so it's probably not an issue.

But for those of you who haven't dove the rigs, suffice it to say that they offer a unique and beautiful dive experience for those of you ready to tackle advanced conditions that include a bottomless (700' deep) dive and the possibility of current. If you're interested, our next two rig trips are August 18 on the *Mr. C*, and September 14 on the *Sea Bass*.

*Prices are all inclusive (air, food, and beverages). Non-members add \$10 for single day and \$15 for two-day dives. New members paying full annual membership allowed one single day dive at approximately two-thirds of member price. Free Diver price is 75% of full price. Bubblewatchers price is 50% of full price. Dive 02-C14 does not include air, food, and beverages. All dives except 02-C14 and 02-10 are limited load of 28 divers. Dive 02-10 (a.k.a. Bugzilla) is a limited load of 24 divers.

Great Escape - Long Beach Sportfishing, Berth 55

South on 710 freeway, exit at Pico off ramp, thru light, right at first driveway past traffic signal. Park in "Sportfishing Parking" after unloading car.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 4 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 21 days prior to the dive to be confirmed.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.
- E) Pre-assignment of bunks will be made on a first paid basis for selected dives.
- F) Executive Officers and club members who annually support at least one third of Sea Diver charters may pay on the boat but must get prior approval from the Dive Boat Reservationist or the Club President.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.

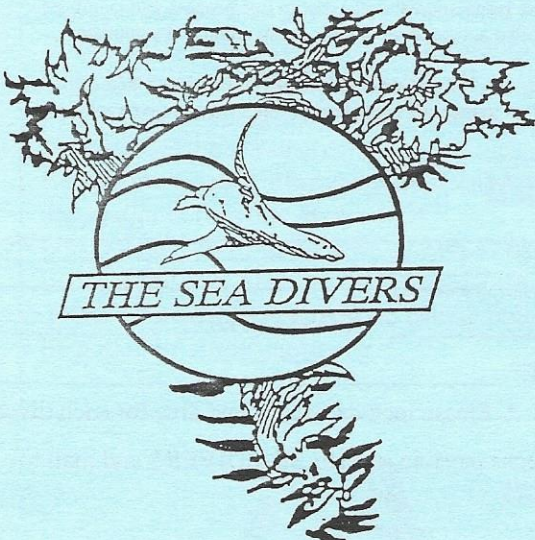
